Canberra Alpine Club

The Club was formed on 31 July 1934 at the Alpine Hotel, Kiandra and was incorporated on 29 June 1955 (registration number A.19).

The motion to form the Club was put by Tim Ingram and Tom Campbell at a meeting chaired by H.J. Lamble, then Director of the NSW Government Tourist Bureau. The inaugural general meeting was held at the Hotel Canberra on 11 October 1934 to elect office bearers and a committee and to ratify the provisional operating arrangements.

The Club is governed by a written Constitution, By-laws and the *Associations Incorporation Act 1991*. The present Constitution, which has been subject to minor amendments, was adopted in 1996 and the By-laws are revised annually and circulated each June.

The objects of the Club include promoting snowsports and bushwalking, fostering the conservation of the alpine environment and the interest of members in matters of historical or heritage significance to skiing or bushwalking including the preservation of buildings, sites and objects.

The Club is a corporate member of Snowsports ACT. The Club is also a member of SLOPES (Ski Lodges of Perisher, Guthega and Smiggins Inc) and of the Kosciuszko Huts Association.

The Mount Franklin Chalet was constructed for the Club in 1938 with bunk accommodation for 32 on leased land. The Chalet reverted to the Government when Namadgi National Park was created in 1984 and was destroyed by bushfires in January 2003, with a new shelter being erected by the ACT Government in 2007. The Mount Franklin precinct is the subject of memoranda of understanding made in 1989 and 1998 between the Club and the ACT Parks and Conservation Service.

The A-frame Perisher lodge was constructed by Club labour in 1961 on land leased from the State of New South Wales. A new lease executed late in 2008 runs until 31 December 2028 – with three 10 year options exercisable after that. This lodge is licensed to accommodate 46 persons and was extended and substantially upgraded in 1983. The bedroom wing was added in 1999, together with wheelchair accessible facilities.

The original Jindabyne lodge was constructed in 1968 on leased land in Banjo Paterson Crescent, adjacent to Lake Jindabyne, and is currently being rebuilt. Freehold title was acquired in 1992.

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Introduction

This report covers the 2013 calendar year, which coincides with the financial year of the Club. It should be read together with the audited financial statements for the Club's financial year ending 31 December 2013 which have been published as a supplement.

While the report formally covers the calendar year, information may also be provided regarding events between the beginning of 2014 and preparation of this report.

PART 1 – PRESIDENTS' REPORT

2013 was an important year in the history of the Club as we commenced the redevelopment of the Jindabyne lodge and improved the amenity of Perisher lodge with the reconstruction of the south deck. At the end of the year Club finances and membership numbers are strong. Working around the unpredictability of the snow season the Club racing and peak season social events were well attended and in February 2014 we all shared the exhilaration and the disappointments of competition at the Sochi Winter Olympic games.

In September 2013, Stephen Bygrave stood down from the position of Club President to accept an exciting job offer in Melbourne. Vice President Lloyd Meehan agreed to accept the role of President for the remainder of the term. Hence, this is a joint report from the two Presidents.

First and foremost we wish to thank the tireless efforts and careful deliberations of the Committee members without whom, many of the accomplishments of the year would not have been possible. Vice Presidents Amanda East and Peter Cunningham, Treasurer Mark King, Secretary Jenny McLeod, Committee Members Kristen Guseli, Paddy Hodgman, Judy Lejins, Christine McLennan, Peter Murphy and Jonathan Wilson, and Public Officer Tony Bolt.

We wish to thank the non-committee members involved in the various sub-committees for their advice and assistance. In particular, the Investigation committee (Tony Bolt, Nevin Agnew, and Ernst Willheim); Jindabyne Redevelopment sub committee (Sam DeLorenzo, Conor McNamara, Mark King and Peter Cunningham); and Jindabyne Furniture sub-committee (Deborah Oswald, Teresa Harrington, Rhonda Cunningham, Lynette Johns-Boast and Femke Rensen).

We wish to thank Club Captain Stephen Bygrave, Perisher Coordinators Amanda East and Andrew McIntyre, Jindabyne Coordinator Rhonda Cunningham and Franklin Coordinator Ian McLeod for their energy and hard work during the year. We would like to thank those members who have volunteered as social and sporting event organisers and lodge leaders. Space does not permit listing everyone in this report but their efforts have been acknowledged in *Frozen Acres* during the year.

We would also like to acknowledge and thank Judy Lejins as Editor of *Frozen Acres* and Administrative Officer Stella McLaughlin. Jill and Ken French's contribution to the management of Perisher Lodge for thirty seasons was acknowledged at the October 2013 Annual Dinner, but is

worthy of another mention in this report.

Last, but certainly not least, we would like to record our heartfelt thanks to the membership at large for their frank and fearless contribution to discussions regarding a number of big decisions that will set the course of the Club for the many years to come. Without that support, encouragement, advice and confidence, the challenge of providing the management and leadership to the Club would be infinitely more difficult.

We are pleased to report that the Club is in a strong financial position. Despite a relatively poor snow season, and the unavailability of Jindabyne since September, the annual result for 2013 was a surplus of \$56,943. This places us in a strong position to proceed with our current capital works program. Details are contained in the Treasurer's Report.

At the time of preparation of this report, membership is 581 of the maximum of 600 allowed by the Constitution. There has been a steady and healthy movement to and from the Club as personal circumstances and priorities change. The Club is continuing to attract new members, and we welcome their active participation in work parties and enthusiastic involvement in social and sporting events.

Bookings remained steady during the year and, although conditions were less than ideal, the lodges were close to capacity throughout the peak season.

A number of social events were held during the year in Canberra and at the lodges. These included the Pre-Season Cocktail Party held in Deakin in May, and the Brumby Cup Dinner, which was held on 17 August despite the races being postponed till September. The Annual Dinner and Trophy Presentation was held at Belconnen in October. This evening included the announcement of the winners of the Brumby Cup.

There was continued strong interest in the history of the Club and our founding members. In conjunction with the Canberra Centenary we received requests for the loan of a number of items of historical interest and photographs featuring skiing in the Brindabellas for public presentation in the Thredbo Ski Museum.

The Club sporting calendar during our Juniors' and Youth weeks, and the Perisher race program became complicated by the need to reschedule events or alter programs because of poor snow conditions. However, examples of innovative off-snow endurance contests, such as snow boot races, proved to great fun and kept everyone entertained. Congratulations

to the thirty seven competitors who participated in the Club Championship on 27 July, those individuals who competed in the CAC Cross-Country Championships and Brumby Races and the teams who competed with distinction in the Perisher and Balmain Cups. A number of Club junior members also performed well at the NSW Interschools, ACT Schools Cup and Australian Interschools Snowsports Championships at Mt Buller.

We would also like to make special mention of CAC member Laura Peel who was awarded ACT Snowsports Athlete of the Year for a second time, and represented Australia at the Sochi Winter Olympics – with an excellent result of 7th.

Work parties were conducted during the year to continue our important maintenance program at Jindabyne, Perisher and O’Keefe’s Hut. In November members attended a work party and celebrated the 75th anniversary of the opening of the Chalet at Mount Franklin. Two work parties were conducted in September to strip the furnishings and interior fittings from Jindabyne Lodge prior to its demolition.

During the year, our Perisher lodge capital improvement program continued with installation of new ovens in the kitchen and the construction of a steel replacement of the old wooden deck. Future plans include the construction of a roof and partial enclosure of the deck to create a new dining area.

Following the resolution at last year’s AGM, the Club has commenced the redevelopment of Jindabyne. After a formal tender process, Dovetail Construction of Jindabyne was contracted to build the Architect David Law designed Lodge. In September, Westpac approved a 15 year commercial redraw loan to the value of \$1 million with an interest rate based on the 90 day bank bill swap rate. After handover to the builder in early October, the project proceeded quickly with demolition of the old lodge and the foundations completed in October.

The original suppliers of the Structural Insulated Panels failed to order critical raw materials and could not meet our delivery schedule. The builder made the decision to cancel the existing supply contract and engage Promat of Adelaide as the alternative supplier of the panels. These supply delays, contract renegotiation and the Christmas New Year shutdown period has meant that the project is roughly eight weeks behind schedule.

As work recommences in February, it is hoped that the builder can regain some lost time, but it is now likely that the project will not be completed

prior to the commencement of the ski season in June 2014. Although this has been a significant source of frustration for all concerned, we would like to take this opportunity in praising the professionalism and commitment of our builder, Mel Kroenert, and architect, David Law, during this difficult period.

Delays aside, after countless hours of discussions, translating plans and drawings, anguishing over detail of interior furniture and fittings, the “grand design” is now becoming an exciting reality. It is an important time in the history of the Club and we are grateful for the opportunity to make a contribution.

PART 2 - OPERATIONS

The Club's operations are directed generally by the Committee, assisted by sub-committees and working groups convened by Committee members or interested members.

FINANCES

(Treasurer: Mark King)

2013 Result

The 2013 ski season was not as good a season for snow as 2012. Nevertheless the Club's financial performance remained strong – though advance bookings for 2014 are down on the previous year. Cost Centre net results, after allowing for depreciation and lease amortisation, and matching income and expenditure to the applicable year, were:

The Net Profit result includes an Extraordinary Expense of \$24,831 on the revaluation of the Jindabyne Lodge to zero on its demolition. This is a non-cash amount and reflects the undepreciated amount of the lodge construction costs at that time.

(The Club recorded a Net Profit of \$91,160 for the 2012 year)

Capital Contributions and Entrance Fees

The contribution to the net result from Capital Contributions and Entrance Fees remains critical to the Club's financial performance. For 2013 these elements of the Capital Fund totalled \$109,285.

Trading

Total income attributable to the Administration cost centre was \$59,721 comprising subscriptions of \$49,545, interest income of \$7,187, cancellation fees of \$2,047 and sundry income of \$941.

The administrative expenses of the Club for the year were \$57,774 with

major items of expenditure being a portion of contract payments to the Club's Administrative Officer of \$14,428, *Frozen Acres* production and distribution costs of \$7,802, audit and bank fees of \$8,761, and insurance of \$3,101. The Club contributed \$7,891 to ski development and training programs for its members throughout the year.

Perisher accommodation receipts remained consistent at \$161,827 but continue to fall short of the running costs of \$193,621.

Jindabyne accommodation receipts contributed income of \$23,658. Expenses were \$24,475 plus the Extraordinary Expense of \$24,831.

The Club's social functions exceeded the budgeted 'break even' position and produced a net profit of \$3,155. It is possible Club members are not claiming all costs associated with social functions.

Balance Sheet

There was a net decrease in cash held for the year of \$190,808, attributable to the commencement of the Jindabyne Lodge redevelopment and the Club contributing cash before loan drawdown commencement. Cash assets at 31 December 2013 were \$164,320.

Property values are included in the Balance Sheet at cost less accumulated depreciation. At last independent market valuation (24 September 2007) the Perisher property was valued at \$1,920,000. The Jindabyne Lodge has been written down to zero and the Redevelopment Work In Progress value is \$385,626.

Perisher Redevelopment Loan

During the year the Club closed out its loan with the Commonwealth Bank and entered into a Business Finance Agreement with Westpac Bank. The details of this Agreement are:

The loan is interest-only to September 2014, thereafter principal & interest.

There is a Facility Fee of 1% of the loan balance per annum.

At 31 December 2013, \$111,811 had been drawn down on this loan.

Auditor

Mr Patrick Salter, Chartered Accountant, has provided an unqualified audit opinion on the Club's 2013 financial report.

Insurance Cover

During the year the Club's Insurance Broker (All Class) went into receivership. SLOPES coordinated coverage through JUA Underwriting Agency and the Club remains fully insured.

The principal policies provide the following cover at each of the lodges:

The policy excess amounts are (generally) \$2,500. The policies provide cover to specific sub-limits for accidental damage, burglary, theft, and a range of other risks.

The Club maintains a group accident policy providing limited cover for members and persons attending organised Club work parties and other functions.

Persons representing the Club at sanctioned snow sports events or participating in Club events are generally covered under a policy maintained by Ski and Snowboard Australia. This policy also provides Broadform (Public/Products) Liability cover of \$10,000,000, Professional Indemnity cover of \$2,000,000 and Directors and Officers Liability cover of \$1,000,000.

The Club maintains a Voluntary Workers insurance policy which, in broad terms, covers members on and travelling to working bees.

Workers Compensation insurance policies are maintained for ACT and NSW to cover contractors and employees of the Club.

GOVERNANCE

(Convenor: Stephen Bygrave/Lloyd Meehan)

General Meeting

The 2013 Annual General Meeting (AGM) was conducted at the Canberra Bridge Club in Deakin on Wednesday 20 March 2013. In addition to the normal AGM business, an update on the Jindabyne redevelopment was provided. Two member motions relating to deferring the redevelopment were defeated by ballot.

Committee Meetings

Committee Changes

Damien Russet retired at the 2013 AGM, and Paddy Hodgman and Jonathon Wilson joined the Committee as Ordinary Committee members. Stephen Bygrave was elected to President, and Peter Cunningham became Immediate Past President.

Stephen Bygrave resigned as President on 2 September due to taking up a job in Melbourne. Lloyd Meehan was elected as President, Peter Cunningham as Vice-President, and Stephen continued on the Committee as Immediate Past President.

Investigation Committee

A complaint was received during the year regarding the conduct of a member. The complaint was referred to the Investigation Panel, and subsequently another counter-complaint was made regarding the conduct of the original complainant. The Investigation Committee considered both complaints, and while considering that the complaints were not trivial, also considered that no breach of the Constitution or by-laws had occurred, or any behaviour incompatible with membership of the Club.

The Committee accepted the findings of the Investigation Committee, wrote to each of the complainants reminding them of general standards of

behaviour, and took no further formal action.

LODGES

(Convenor: Peter Cunningham)

It was a year of major works at Perisher and a pivotal year for Jindabyne. This was the last year for the Jindabyne lodge which has stood us in good stead for over 40 years. The building pre-dated environmental construction practices such as wall insulation, it had been attacked by termites, the electrical wiring was breaking down and the plumbing fragile. This, in addition to changed expectation in comfort levels had made the building obsolete. The last fire was held in the lodge in September as it was stripped of valuables before the demolition.

Perisher (Lodge Coordinator: Amanda East)

The highlight of the year was the completion of the replacement deck on the south east end of the building. The construction certificate was issued in March and Cooma Steel was finally able to schedule the work into their busy program, made difficult by challenging weather and extremely difficult access. The huge beams were carried in by volunteers and the decking mesh had to be 'trollied' by hand around the base of the building, however Ken French was on the spot to do liaison and provided invaluable assistance. His ingenious adaptation of a furniture trolley to manoeuvre the heavy grid mesh through the building was greatly appreciated by the boys. The deck flooring installation was outsourced to a local builder who finished the job in early snow showers.

The storage of personal items not in lockers or ski racks had become a safety issue and members were requested to remove all unsecured items so an audit of the space could be completed and new storage facilities created. During the summer work parties, the loft space to bedroom 7 was converted to general storage space and is now accessed from the upper level. New shelves were built creating a tidy and ordered space. Compliance with new restrictions on storage bags by members has been gratifying. In the basement, boot shelves were constructed for those who have paid for ski racks and the racks on the east side upgraded. There are still a number of unclaimed items.

General housekeeping continued, in particular mattresses and pillows were replaced, extra doonas provided and bed linen refreshed to keep the bedrooms looking smart. Some minor rearrangement of beds occurred to allow greater flexibility and comfort. In the kitchen, the drawers and shelves were sorted, with crockery, pots and appliances renewed as

required. This year the ovens were replaced providing increased capacity and four separate cooking compartments, an improvement that seemed to work well through the winter. The required emergency exit from the lower level through the men's wash area was completed and is available to provide a novel cold finish to a shower.

Concerns about fire protection of the building have resulted in a total reversal of NPWS tree management policy for our lodge and we are now required to prune dead tree timber from the perimeter. We continue to keep the site pristine with removal of exotic grasses and weeds.

Work parties at Perisher continue to be well attended with an average of 21, the majority of whom were members. There were four work parties and a couple of extra visits from members with special skills who made the completion of the deck before the winter possible, in particular Peter Richards, a proficient sailor who did the cables for the handrail.

Jindabyne (Lodge Coordinator: Rhonda Cunningham)

Two maintenance work parties were conducted during the year in March and May with all working bees being well attended by a combination of members and waiting list people.

The main work effort for these working bees was on normal maintenance activities with only minor improvement works such as painting, gardening, etc being conducted in order to maintain the lodge in a serviceable condition. No capital works were undertaken at Jindabyne Lodge because of the rebuild.

Two final working bees were held on consecutive weekends in late September to clean out the lodge and put all furniture, etc into storage during the rebuild.

Jindabyne Lodge was once again cleaned by a cleaning contractor who maintained their previous high standard to keep the Lodge clean, particularly during the winter.

Mount Franklin (Coordinator: Ian McLeod)

2013 was the 75th anniversary of the opening of the Mount Franklin Chalet. The ACT Parks Service offered to run a public open day and sausage sizzle to mark the occasion. This was held on 3 December. Despite good publicity, we noted only four visitors; possibly would-be visitors were deterred by a very hot windy day with fire bans in adjoining NSW. However more than 25 members, past members and a few friends arrived, so the day was very successful as a back-to-Mount Franklin

event.

Another open day, held on 21 April as part of the ACT and Region Heritage Festival, was more successful, attracting about 20 visitors as well as a number of club members. As usual, a work party was held on the day before each open day, and as usual the major tasks were continuing maintenance and improvement of Wombat Walk and feral weed control plus minor maintenance work on and around the shelter. After years of work by some dedicated people the weeds are now under control in the shelter environs, but are not and never will be eliminated.

When the shelter was built in 2007, one objective was that it be used to display the historic ski equipment donated to the club. Until recently the articles stored there have been stacked on shelves and benches and displayed to some extent only on open days. During the year nine skis, showing the progression of ski technology from pre-World War II, together with old stocks and climbing skins, were fixed to the wall using cable ties so the historic articles were not damaged. The Parks Service arranged explanatory signage which matches the style of the external signage. Racks for the remaining equipment will be installed in 2014.

O'Keefe's Hut (Coordinator: Jack Palmer/Wayne Puckett)

A work party was held at O'Keefe's Hut in March, with workers papering walls, weeding, and generally cleaning, as well as having time for side trips to Jagungal by foot or further south by mountain bike. Caretaking duties were handed over from Jack Palmer to Wayne Puckett at the work party, however with Wayne's departure from the Club in 2014 a new caretaker is required.

BOOKINGS

(Convenor: Peter Murphy)

Bookings for 2013 were reasonable considering the relatively poor snow season. While Jindabyne bookings were noticeably lower than 2012, Perisher had less of a decrease and total bookings were down by only 12.4%. However with the poor snow early in the season, and a warm spell and rain reducing cover in September, off-peak bookings were significantly down. Appendix 2 of the report provides a comprehensive summary of bookings information during the year.

Online booking system

The sub-committee has investigated several online booking systems, including feedback from other clubs using the systems under

consideration. We are currently seriously testing one system, CBDWeb, to establish specific capabilities in relation to our quite complex booking and membership rules. While there are quite a few issues to resolve, the system does look promising. Regardless of the capabilities of any system, bookings will still be able to be made directly with the Administrative Officer if members prefer.

Booking privileges

A number of members were granted booking privileges (primarily extra Saturday nights) which are approved by the Committee. A list of these is included in Appendix 3.

Administrative Officer.

The committee would like to thank Stella for her ongoing efforts with managing the Club's bookings – a difficult task undertaken with efficiency and fairness. Many thanks from all of us.

SNOWSPORTS

(Convener and Club Captain: Stephen Bygrave)

After early snowfalls in May, snow enthusiasts were crossing fingers and toes for a promising season. It was not to be, with the early cover not holding up to weather conditions that followed. We still maintained a high level of participation in various Ski Development Programs including both Junior and Adult members, across snowboarding, alpine and cross country.

Elite Performance

Laura Peel will have competed in the Sochi Olympic Games Women's Aerials by the time this goes to print. She was awarded the ACT Snowsports Athlete of the Year in recognition of her international performances over the 2012-13 season, which included two podium finishes and ten top ten finishes overall. A big congratulations to Laura for achieving her dream of representing her country at the Olympic games.

Racing

With the slow start in terms of snowfall we had to make changes to our race program, cancelling both our Juniors' and Youth week races, and postponing some others. Perisher Race Department had their work cut

out for them trying to juggle and move events while keeping the majority of clubs across the resort happy.

The Club Championships were held at Mother-In-Law in interesting conditions – the first race of the season to be held at Perisher, due to the early season poor cover. This event was a great opportunity for several of our younger members to practice on the same course used for ACT Schools cup and ACT Southern NSW Interschools.

The Brumby and President's Cup were held on Upper Rollercoaster after being postponed by a fortnight by Perisher – a flow-on effect from the lack of snow earlier in the season. It was a beautiful warm and sunny day, therefore snow conditions were tricky. Snow conditions did not allow for a double GS course to be set, so racing was completed on a single course, with three timed runs contributing to results.

The Balmain Cup saw Canberra Alpine Club placed at a very encouraging 2nd overall, and thanks to our teams we were awarded 1st place in Snowboard, 2nd in Slalom and Giant Slalom, and a 3rd in Cross Country. Our younger members certainly stepped up in this event.

CAC was represented in the Paddy Pallin Junior Cross Country Event, with Sandra and Tony Greville handing over the organisational reins to the next generation of Tim Greville and Pip Daley.

The CAC Cross Country Championships were held, as usual, in conjunction with The KAC, run from Perisher Valley to Charlotte Pass. Tim Greville finished a very creditable 13th overall in the KAC, becoming CAC XC Club Champion.

The Club fielded two teams in the Perisher Cup; Women's and Open. Our women (Nicola and Lara Agnew, Caitlin and Lauren Wilson-Bygrave) did us proud, winning the Women's Cup (The Perisher Bowl). CAC was well represented in other events including the Australian Interschools held at Mt Buller. Congratulations to Will Crowe, Nicola Agnew, Liz Hodgman, Annabelle Ledger, Duncan Ledger, Sarah Brake, Lara Agnew, Jennifer Kerr, Andrew Kerr, Valentino Guseli (National Champion in GS and Boarder Cross) and William Brake on your Nationals selection and participation. Valentino also competed further afield taking on the youngsters at the New Zealand Nationals in Cardrona, and the USA Nationals at Copper Mountain, with several podiums in a range of snowboard disciplines. Congratulations to Valentino, receiving ACT Snowsports Junior Snowboarder of the Year, and Lara Agnew, an ACT Snowsports Junior Alpine Achievement Award.

Full results for Club events have been published in *Frozen Acres* throughout the year, and the full list of awards is in Appendix 5.

SOCIAL

(Convenor: Lloyd Meehan/Judy Lejins)

A number of social events were held during the year in Canberra and at the Lodges. The social sub committee comprised Lloyd Meehan (convenor until September when he took over as President), Judy Lejins (Convenor), Lou Hodgman, Jenny McLeod, Kristen Guseli, Christine McLennan, and Rhonda Cunningham.

The social calendar started with 41 members attending the Pre-Season Cocktail Party held at the MS Society function room in Deakin on 18 May. It was a great time to make new friends and renew old acquaintances. An early 15 centimetres of snow at Perisher in May gave great hopes for a good season but sadly this was not to be.

A highlight of the work parties conducted at both lodges throughout the year were the Saturday night dinners, some were dress themed or special menus and many reported in *Frozen Acres*.

Regional events such as the Snowy Mountains of Music on the June long weekend proved popular drawcards to the lodges prior to the start of the season. Heavy rain fell, washing away the early snows of May, but stopped just before the festival commenced.

The Club Championship dinner was held following the competition on 27 July. Following a French theme, resplendent with Lou Hodgman suitably dressed in black and white as the lead chef, waitress and organiser.

Despite the Brumby Cup competition being postponed to September due to snow conditions, the Brumby Cup dinner proceeded with gusto with participants having an enjoyable evening and expending all their unused energy.

On 19 October the Club held its annual presentation dinner at Kangara Waters Belconnen, where trophies were awarded for sporting prowess and other contributions. Trophy winners are listed in Appendix 5.

OH&S

(Convener: Lloyd Meehan/Paddy Hodgman)

Prior to assuming his role as President, Lloyd Meehan was the convenor

for the OH&S sub-committee. During this time he created the initial structure for the Club risk register. After Lloyd's election as President, he handed the OH&S convenor role over to Paddy Hodgman. The first priority has been to convene the sub-committee, and despite some delays that has now occurred with its initial meeting initially scheduled for late 2013, and due to unanticipated causes, rescheduled to early 2014. The sub-committee's surest priorities are to populate the risk register fully, and initiate treatment of the identified risks. The sub-committee is also reviewing its role, scope and membership, with a view to more substantial progress during 2014 and, particularly, to ensure OH&S risk assessment of the new Jindabyne lodge.

PLANNING AND ENVIRONMENT / JINDABYNE REDEVELOPMENT

(Convenor: Peter Cunningham)

It has been a very active year for the Planning sub-committee which continued to progress the redevelopment of the Jindabyne Lodge and the extension of the Perisher dining room.

Jindabyne

The Jindabyne redevelopment has received full focus and construction has now commenced. The following significant milestones were achieved:

January

- An update report on the Jindabyne Lodge Redevelopment was distributed to Members in *Frozen Acres*
- Retention of architect David Law to progress the building through the detailed design, Development Application (DA), Construction Certificate (CC) and Construction documentation phase.
- Letter of Appointment offered to Dovetail to proceed through to detailed design, estimation and documentation stage.

February

- A Jindabyne Lodge redevelopment information night for members was held at the Canberra Bridge Club on Tuesday 19th February and was attended by over 40 members plus our architect, David Law, and our appointed builder, Mel Kronert from Dovetail Constructions.
- Progressed the design to a full detailed design with co-ordination between the architect (David Law), the builder (Dovetail Constructions Pty Ltd) and the Club. This phase involved a build-ability assessment of the design and all construction aspects in order to ensure the best results, minimise costs and minimise unforeseen design changes during construction.

March

- At the 2013 AGM there was general reaffirmation that the membership is still overwhelmingly in favour the Jindabyne Redevelopment proposal that had been passed at the 2012 AGM and endorsed in the April 2012 postal vote.
- Prepared detailed designs and DA in conjunction with Ezzy Architects (David Law) and the builder Dovetail Constructions.
- On 21 March 2013, the DA was submitted to Snowy River Shire Council (SRSC).

April-July

- Development Approval granted on 17 July - this was about 6 weeks later than expected which squeezed our final design and estimating stage significantly.
- The engineering structural design was completed following the DA approval by a structural engineer with extensive SIPS experience.

August

- Bank finance approved with a Westpac loan facility. The loan is for a commercial redraw limit of \$1M and is a 90 day bank bill swap at a rate of 5.43% which is reset every 90 days. It is a 15 year loan which will be interest only for the first year then revert to principal and interest for the remainder of the loan. During the construction phase at the conclusion of each month the builder invoices the Club for progress payments which are assessed as a percentage stage of the total build cost by Sam Delorenzo. Sam then recommends the loan drawdown payment to Westpac. Sam has been appointed by the bank for this quantity survey task because he has the appropriate building qualifications to conduct this

activity.

- Finalization of the detailed design and builder's final construction estimate.

September:

- The CAC committee made the decision to proceed with the Jindabyne Lodge Redevelopment on Monday 2 September.
- The Club signed a lump sum Builders Contract with our builder Dovetail Constructions (Mel Kroenert) which is capped at \$1,197,000. The building is programmed for completion by 1 June 2014.
- Prepared the Construction Certificate for submission to the SRSC for approval before construction commencement.
- Conducted two working bees on 21-22 and 28-29 September to strip out the lodge and place the furniture and chattels in storage until the new lodge is finished. We have hired a storage facility at Leesville Estate in Jindabyne until the completion of the new lodge next year. The final working bee was held with a final celebration and "wake" for the lodge. A big thank you for all who attended and did all the heavy lifting, sorting and packing at both working bees.

October:

- Construction Certificate application submitted on 3 October.
- The builder Dovetail took possession of the site on 1 October. From this point until completion members are not allowed to access the site unless pre-arrangements are made with the builder by the Club.
- By 11 October the old lodge had been totally cleared and the site re-surveyed for the new building. Following this the footings were poured, including the extra piers required at the rear near the sewerage manhole, decking and ground floor block work finished.
- The builder provided weekly reports and photos which have been put on our Facebook site and website.
- A Furniture sub group was established to complete the room and furniture layouts, purchase of furnishings and equipment for the new lodge. This group has been progressing well with furniture orders to be placed soon for delivery at completion.

November onwards:

We have been in dispute with the Snowy River Shire Council (SRSC) over the required payment for their Section 64 Sewerage and Water connection contribution. The SRSC have charged us for 10 bedrooms when their previous policy states that it should be levied on the increase in bedroom numbers, which in our case is from eight to ten. This means a difference in payments from \$6,776 to \$22,189, a substantial cost for us. An interim compromise was reached where we have paid the initial \$6,776 with a bank guarantee lodged for the remainder (\$15,413). This enabled work to commence.

In February 2014 we lodged a Section 82A appeal Review of Condition 7 of our Development Application (DA 0102/2013) against the SRSC interpretation of their S64 planning rules using our town planning consultant, Dabyne Planning, and have engaged Sydney lawyers Sparke-Helmore to give expert local government law advice. It is expected to cost us up to \$2,000 to conduct our appeal but this needs to be judged against the certain loss of \$16,000 if we fail.

After very good initial progress during October and November the Jindabyne redevelopment has experienced a delay caused by a failure in the delivery of the SIPS panels. After a considerable amount of discussion between our builder, Dovetail, and the supplier, Magroc, including emails with their Canadian parent, it was finally decided to terminate their contract. Dovetail managed to locate an alternative supplier, Promat, also based in Adelaide, and after a factory visit prior to Christmas a contract was placed.

The first deliveries are expected in late February and construction will commence in full again. After a period of minimal activity the builder is very keen to resume and will be endeavouring to make up some of the lost time. The new Promat panels are metric whereas the Magroc panels were imperial, necessitating some minor adjustments by the architect, David Law, to some structural dimensions and window placements. This was completed and forwarded to Promat in late December. The panels will be supplied pre-cut to size with doors, windows, etc already cut out for minimal on-site work.

The construction delay is estimated to be 8 weeks which means there is a possibility that completion date may slip into July. We will have a clearer idea as construction progresses. It is an unfortunate development but the Committee and the builder remain positive and optimistic that the project will be delivered successfully and within budget. To our advantage the builder, Dovetail, is very committed to the project as they see a great future in SIPS buildings.

MEMBERSHIP

(Convenor: Jenny McLeod)

Membership dropped slightly at the beginning of 2013, but held fairly steady throughout the year, just below the Constitutional limit of 600 members. At 31 December 2013 total membership was 593, with another 59 people associated with the Club as ex-active members or on the waiting list to become members. As membership is below the limit, those on the waiting list were able to move to full membership as they became eligible.

During 2013, the Committee re-admitted one person whose membership had lapsed. The Committee continues to view membership as a valuable asset and is sympathetic when people have a change of heart or circumstances and want to resume their membership (rather than apply to

be new members).

PUBLIC RELATIONS

(Convenor: Jenny McLeod; *Frozen Acres* editor: Judy Lejins)

To celebrate the Canberra Centenary, the Thredbo Historical Society curated an exhibition of Skiing in the Brindabellas and Canberra Ski Clubs at their museum in Thredbo. The Club has lent several items for this exhibition, including historical ski equipment and several photos showcasing the history of the Club, particularly covering the Franklin history. The exhibition continues until April 2014.

The Club journal, *Frozen Acres*, is the primary means of disseminating information about the Club and its activities to members, however *Skimail* (email mailing list) is used in particular for reminders and short-notice notifications; the website (www.cac.org.au) is mainly used for slow-changing information for both members and non-members; and the Facebook page is a less formal forum, where any member of the group can exchange information and photos and discuss issues.

Nine issues of *Frozen Acres* were published during 2013. Each month was covered though, as is usually the case, some issues combined two months together. The editor is grateful for the many contributions that were sent in for publication by members, waiters and friends. Lowes Printers continue to give a reliable service both in printing and the delivery of the copies to Stella. Thanks must go too to Stella for the valuable assistance she has given to the editor proofreading items and editing, formatting and presenting the numerous race results all in her own time. She continues to batch each issue but we have retained the courier to pick them up from her and take them to the post office. Each twelve months the issues of *Frozen Acres* covering January to December are bound into a hard cover.

The Club website is primarily used for comparatively slow-changing information such as Club policies and general information about the Club, for members and non-members. We are in the process of looking at options for a significant update of the website to make it easier to maintain.

Skimail was again an important method of communication with members, with 22 Skimails being sent in 2013 and over 300 email addresses on the mailing list. Apart from the usual information on Club and other events, general National Park and resort information, and updates on the progress of Laura Peel's aerals competition results, Skimail was also used to run a

member survey on preferences for an open fireplace for the new lodge.

The Club's Facebook group was well used, with members reporting on snow conditions overseas and in Australia, providing updates on members' racing success, posting photos of Club events, and photos of progress on the Perisher deck and Jindabyne rebuilding.

The Club's Personal Locator Beacon was borrowed only four times in 2013, with two loans for Club events and two for private trips. The PLB is available for loan to any member at no cost for bushwalking, skiing, or other expeditions, in order to improve safety for members on Club or private trips.

THE CLUB BADGE

The distinctive Club badge is quite unlike the badges of more recently formed ski clubs and is typical of the skiing era in which it was designed.

The original badge design, shown above, appeared in December 1936 on a brochure explaining the objects of the Club 'to the citizens of Canberra'. According to the Club's foundation Treasurer, Mr J.C. Anderson, it was adapted from the design, shown below, which appeared on the dust cover of the 1935 Ski Year Book. That design is attributed to a Mrs de Gruchy, who was said to be a member of the Ski Club of Victoria.

This original design changed after some time to a blue diamond with the skier herring-boning in yellow, thus utilising the then national colours, which have also been those of the Club for many years. These colours were adopted by the Territory upon obtaining self-Government (but ceased to be the national colours in the 1980s when the unofficial sporting colours of green and gold were formally adopted by the Commonwealth).
